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Clinical Services Update

For the month of June we are spotlighting all of the clinical services offered here at Nevins, as well as the difference between Medicaid B3 Services and NC Innovations Waiver Services. Nevins offers clinical services to individuals who receive both the North Carolina Innovations Waiver, as well as (B)(3)Services. So what's the difference?

The NC Innovations Waiver is a Medicaid resource for funding services and supports for people with intellectual and other related developmental disabilities who are at risk for institutional care in an Intermediate Care Facility for Individuals with Intellectual Disabilities (ICF-IID). Once an individual receives an Innovations slot, they are eligible for many services that focus on that individual being as independent as possible and integrated into their community, and these services are for a lifetime. There is currently a 7-10 year waiting list (Registry of Unmet Needs) to receive a NC Innovations slot.

(B)(3) Services are available to individuals with intellectual/developmental disabilities who are eligible for Medicaid services based on medical necessity, but have not yet been awarded Innovations Waiver funding. These services use savings from Medicaid funding to meet the support needs of individuals while they are waiting to be awarded additional funding.

What clinical services does Nevins offer? Respite (Innovations and B3): Gives an individual's primary caregiver(s) living in the individual's primary residence a break from providing daily care/supervision to the individual; may be provided in the home or in another setting.

Supported Employment (Innovations and B3): Job training and supports for individuals seek-

ing paid employment. Generally provided in an integrated setting (where there are people with and without disabilities).

Day Supports (Innovations): Can be a group or individual service that emphasizes inclusion and independence. Day Supports provides assistance with acquisition, retention or improvement in self-help, socialization and adaptive skills which takes place in a non-residential setting, separate from the home or facility in which the individual resides

Community Living and Support (Innovations): Provides assistance with daily living skills, personal care tasks, and community activities in a private home (usually a family home).

How can you access services?

The individual or legally responsible person can contact Nevins to request the desired service. The Program Manager of Clinical Services at Nevins will get in touch with Cardinal Innovations to start the eligibility process and ask for service approval. For individuals who currently have Medicaid, but do not have a NC Innovations Waiver, they should call Cardinal
