### **COVID19 Safety Action Plan**

Nevins continues to provide Community Based and In-Home services and beginning July 7th, re-opened the facility for service delivery. We are taking every measure possible to help prevent the spread of COVID-19 and to protect the health and safety of our staff, participants and their families through the execution of our Safety Action Plan. Our action plan not only addresses physical alterations, but has put in place new behaviors by staff and participants, incorporating social distancing measures.

### **Physical Changes:**

- Work stations 6ft. apart.
- Installed no-touch faucets, soap dispensers, and paper towel dispensers.
- Installed kick plates on doors.
- Protective shields on all work stations and partitions between work stations
- Weekly campus-wide professional sanitization services.
- Installed new hospital grade air scrubber filters.
- Full inventory of cleaning supplies and protective gear.

### **Behavioral Changes:**

- Daily temperature checks of staff, participants and guests.
- Masks are required by all staff daily. For the participants that cannot wear masks, staff will be responsible for keeping social distancing.
- Gloves and hand sanitizer available.
- Hand washing policy; Every hour, and before and after snack, and before and after lunch.
- All stations are wiped down with EPArecommended disinfectants every 2 hours.
