

Employee of the Month




Phyllis Haynes, Transportation Team

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NEVINS CHANGING LIVES









John was in his early 20's and was not in a good spot; with his family, with work, or with himself. When John was in 5th Grade he was diagnosed with Tourette's Syndrome (TS). TS involves uncontrollable repetitive movements or unwanted sounds (tics), such as repeatedly blinking the eyes, shrugging shoulders, or blurting out random noises. Individuals with TS, like John, attempt to hold back their tics called "suppression," and some people with TS can suppress longer than others, depending on the person. Many can hold it in for hours, then go home and let it out for five or ten minutes like a balloon that bursts under pressure. Others can't suppress more than a few minutes if at all.

Suppression can be exhausting and that is what lead John to the state he found himself. He didn't realize it at the time, but John does believe that his daily struggle of suppressing his tics directly impacted his energy level. John admits he was lazy, "It was easier to stay home than to face the anticipated energy of the outside world." He wasn't living a life that would guide him to success. John's parents, Robert and Tracy Miller, was worried about John and his destructive behaviors.

Several years earlier, Robert had won tickets to the St. Anthony Foundation's Festa Italiana; a local fundraising event benefiting Nevins Inc. It was through attending this event that the Miller's learned of the Nevins mission and the Supported Employment Program. Over several years they enjoyed attending Festa, but more important they became advocates of Nevins and developed a strong report with staff and developed trust and respect for the mission.

Then one day the Miller's, at a point of absolute frustration, remembered Nevins and decided to learn more about Nevins partnership with Atrium Health. They went to the hospital, met with staff, learned more about the supported employment opportunity and decided this would be a good fit for John.

John began working for the the Nevins Team at Atrium Main as a participant Medical Equipment Technician; picking up, cleaning and delivering equipment. After 3 1/2 years, he was promoted to a Nevins staff position and after a little over a year, in the Spring of 2019, John was hired as a Full Time Atrium Health employee.

John attributes his success to his parents who taught him to have a strong work ethic. He also recognizes that Nevins staff and leadership played a big role in his success because the organization believed in him and his potential. John no longer had workplace issues like he did prior to working on the Nevins/Atrium Team. He enjoys his job and the people he works with. He gets to see his Nevins friends everyday. Most important he knows that he contributes to the overall quality of patient care, especially during this time "with all that is going on in the world." He loves going to work, making money and helping people. He also appreciates the health benefits and pay as it provides him more financial freedom.

John's favorite part is being part of the Nevins family. In his own words, "Finding Nevins not only gave me an extended family, but brought my family closer together". John has grown a lot as a person - to be more responsible, appreciate structure, and to work toward goals. He loves being able to pay his own bills and thrive living on his own.

Clinical Services Update

Nevins takes pride in the service and care we deliver to our participants. Although our service delivery looks different right now due to COVID-19, our standards have remained the same. Our staff are trained to work with individuals who have been diagnosed with various disabilities. When working in this field, it is important that we know how to spot what would be considered an incident.

This month we are going to take a look at what might be considered an "incident", and also what to do if you suspect that an individual with a disability is being mistreated. Below are some examples of incidents that would require Nevins staff to complete an incident report:

- Medication error (client missed a dose of medication, client refused a medication, client took the wrong medication)
- <u>Injury</u>: Assault, vehicle accident, trip or fall, suicide attempt, death
- <u>Client Behavior</u>: aggression, destruction of property, inappropriate sexual behavior, Allegation of exploitation, abuse, neglect (AWOL)

What Are Abuse and Neglect?

- Abuse willful infliction of physical pain, injury or mental anguish, unreasonable confinement, or the willful deprivation by a caretaker of services necessary to maintain mental and physical health.
- **Neglect** a disabled adult who is either living alone and not able to provide for himself the

services necessary to maintain his mental or physical health or is not receiving services from his caretaker.

• **Exploitation** – illegal or improper use of a disabled adult or his resources for another's profit or advantage.

What/who Is A Mandated Reporter? A mandated reporter is a person who, because of his or her profession, is legally required to report any suspicion of child abuse or neglect to the relevant authorities.

Please note that ALL Nevins staff are mandated reporters

So How Do I Report Suspected Abuse Outside Of Nevins? North Carolina law protects disabled adults of any age from abuse, neglect and exploitation. The law states that "any person having reasonable cause to believe that a disabled adult is in need of protective services shall report such information. In Mecklenburg County, Adult Protective Services (APS) provides protective services to disabled adults, 18 years of age or older who are alleged to be abused, neglected, or exploited and in need of protection. APS Social Workers evaluate the reports and assess the disabled adult's capacity to consent for services.

To report instances of abuse, neglect or exploitation of an older or disabled adult, please call 704-336-CARE (2273) immediately.


