Dear Friends:

As I complete my first 30 days as Interim Executive Director at Nevins I am pleased to report that we are still delivering outstanding service as we "create opportunities". We continue to work with over 40 ambitious individuals who provide support services for Atrium Health.

Our Program and clinical staff recently completed an annual update with the State of North Carolina's Medicaid consultant and Nevins Inc received another clean bill of health! We continue to provide "in home" services for those approximately 45 individuals requesting Nevins to continue their work during our temporary campus closure. Programs and Clinical staff are also planning an all staff training program for later this fall.

Festa Italiana was held virtually this year and you can read more about it elsewhere in this newsletter. Nevins Inc remains extremely grateful to Dr. Voci and the entire Festa team for keeping Nevins as the beneficiary of this wonderful community event.

Nevins Inc will be hiring a full time Human Resources Manager. This work has been previously handled by a number of different staff and we will see significant improvements in the HR area as a result of consolidating different functions into this position.

The Nevins Board of Directors is hard at work conducting a search for a new permanent Executive Director. Over 100 candidates have applied and the search committee for the Board is narrowing down the list to a few outstanding individuals who will be interviewed. The quality of the applicant pool was excellent and I am sure everybody (including me) is looking forward to the Board appointing a new Executive Director.

NEVINS CHANGING LIVES







Despite the challenges that Nevins has faced with COVID-19, the needs of Nevins Inc participants haven't changed. Some individuals miss being involved in their community, others wish they could participate with Nevins in-person programs working on improving their skills. For Deionna, it is the many friendships she has made during her 4 years spent on campus.

Deionna, 24, and her mother Loretta first learned about Nevins from someone they met in the public who asked about Deionna. Learning that this organization can provide her emotional support and opportunities to travel, her family decided to give Nevins a try.

Deionna is involved in Nevins' Abilities and Possibilities program where she takes part in community and site-based activities that build her skills. Math is an aspect of A&P that she particularly enjoys. In Aktion Club, coordinated by Delores Miller, she gives back to the community through volunteer work at food banks and donating school supplies. After a day's hard work, the club will sometimes get together for a dance party. Furthermore, Deionna has a history of cheerleading experience for the Nevins' basketball team as well as within a cheerleading team for special needs adults in Charlotte.

On September 26th, the St. Anthony Foundation hosted its 15th Annual Festa Italiana with the purpose of benefiting Nevins Inc. As part of the event's silent auction, a group of individuals made a collaborative effort to create a painting using colors that they believed symbolized the impact that Nevins has made on their lives. With a color that makes her feel happy, Deionna painted the piece with streaks of green. She and other participants also sang a song called "The Spaghetti Song" while performing a dance using colored scarves of the Italian flag.

Once the Nevins campus reopens, the first thing Deionna will do is reconnect with her friends. "I can't wait to see and talk to everyone," she said. She misses her conversations with Courtney and the laughs shared with Gabrielle. However, the pandemic hasn't hindered her from doing the activities she loves. Nevins offers virtual programs for individuals to take part in through Zoom meetings. Deionna enjoys all activities from superhero yoga on Tuesdays to singing rock 'n' roll songs on Thursdays. "It's awesome!" At home, she likes to draw, bake cookies and blueberry muffins, and write fairytale and adventure stories.

In 2016, Deionna won the category for "Most Beautiful" in her first pageant. Two years later, she won her category of North Carolina Jr. Miss 2018 in the annual pageant hosted by Miss Amazing, which then led to her spot in the nationals held in Chicago, IL. She became friends with most of the people she met in her pageant experience. "I liked to meet new people," she said, "I had fun." This December, Deionna will be launching her modeling career. A talent agency selected her for a program she applied for earlier this year. She will take acting classes to prep her for appearances in commercials or roles as an extra in movies.

As for Deionna's future goals, the sky is not the limit! She can envision herself as a TV actress, designer, or author of a book about special needs. Nevins helps her work towards her goals by providing her opportunities to exercise her relationship skills and express her creativity in a number of areas.

Clinical Services Update

Nevins day placement center continues to be closed for on-site services, however we continue to provide services in the community or the homes of the individuals that we serve. We are continuing to evaluate COVID-19 status and will determine a date for reopening the Nevins day placement facility based on Governor Cooper's timing for Phase 3. In the meantime, it is important that we continue to do our part, as a community, to remain safe not only from COVID-19, but from flu.

The Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) urges that getting a flu vaccine is more important than ever during 2020-2021 to protect yourself and the people around you from flu, and to help reduce the strain on healthcare systems responding to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Who should get vaccinated this season?
