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Clinical Services Update

With the arrival of Flu season, Nevins would like to share some healthy habits to help prevent the Flu both at home and in the community.

Experts believe the single best way to prevent seasonal flu is to get vaccinated each year, but good health habits like avoiding people who are sick, covering your cough and washing your hands often can help stop the spread of germs and prevent the influenza as well.

Tips to protect yourself and others from flu and help stop the spread of germs:

- Avoid close contact. Avoid close contact with people who are sick. When you are sick, keep your distance from others to protect them from getting sick, too.
- **Stay home when you are sick.** If possible, stay home from work, school, and errands when you are sick. This will help prevent spreading your illness to others.
- Cover your mouth and nose. Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when coughing or sneezing. It may prevent those around you from getting sick.
 Respiratory illnesses are spread by cough, sneezing, or unclean hands.
- **Clean your hands.** Washing your hands often will help protect you from germs. If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth. Germs are often spread when a person touches something that is contaminated with germs and then touches his or her eyes, nose, or mouth.
- Practice other good health habits. Clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces at home, work or school, especially when someone is ill. Get plenty of sleep, be physically active, manage your stress, drink plenty of fluids, and eat nutritious food.




TECHNOLOGY DRIVE

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NEVINS CHANGING LIVES



In July, our supervisor of the Supported Employment Program, Jonathan, opened the doors to his new small business, The Gathering Grounds. Located a few miles away from Nevins' campus in The Plaza, the coffee shop serves a wide selection of treats and refreshments including delicious frappes, cooling smoothies, and their signature item--million dollar pound cake. But there is a deeper inspiration behind the launch of his business than Charlotte's love for coffee. The Gathering Grounds employs two of our beloved individuals who help keep the shop a clean and fun place to work.

Jonathan decided to locate The Gathering Grounds in The Plaza because it would be The Plaza's first franchise coffee shop, so there would be no competition within the complex. During the pandemic, he realized that there are individuals who are in need of work, which inspired him to root his coffee shop to a more meaningful purpose.

The Supported Employment Program is a service that helps individuals with the primary diagnosis of I/DD learn the skills necessary to find, gain and retain meaningful employment. This includes everything from developing a resume or identifying an area of employment interest through working with the individuals one-on-one or group setting on the job. It was through this

program that the two individuals were brought on to the crew.

One of the individuals employed at The Gathering Grounds is Anthony, a student at Central Piedmont who had been seeking an opportunity to make extra cash during the pandemic. Ever since his first day of work, Anthony arrives at every shift with a jovial and can-do attitude. He likes all his duties at the shop, but keeping the space clean is what he enjoys most. Anthony likes greeting customers as well. Each of the individuals work ten hours a week, but Anthony plans on doubling his hours at the coffee shop. When he receives his biweekly paycheck, the first thing he does is buy his favorite cookies from Amazon: Chips Ahoy's Reese's Peanut Butter Cup. In his free time, Anthony loves to ride his bike and play video games.


A long-term goal that Jonathan has for The Gathering Grounds is to employ more individuals and to expand the space. Currently, the two employed individuals specialize in janitorial work and greeting customers. His vision is that the operation will one day be run by the individuals--to be responsible for opening the register, completing inventory, and serving customers. As the crew works everyday toward that goal, Jonathan witnesses firsthand how they learn and grow from their employment.

Thank you Elevation Church Outreach





Jade Boling, Nevins Board Member



Let us introduce you to the longest-serving Nevins board member, Jade Boling! He has been with Nevins through so many "dramatic changes" and many accomplishments over his 17 years on the board.

He was first introduced to Nevins in 2000 when he was invited to a Nevins fundraiser. Jade visited the campus, began getting to know the staff, and volunteered at a golf fundraising event for many years. "Needless to say, I quickly fell in love with the participants and the staff." Jade officially joined the board in late 2003.

Jade reflects on the challenges Nevins has faced & pivotal moments like when Nevins was struggling financially. He mentions how this is no longer the case, thanks to a lot of hard work from the Nevins staff to turn it around. Events like the first St. Anthony's Foundation Festa Italiana fundraiser took place in 2006 and has continued to generate roughly \$20 -\$25K a year in donations for Nevins. He was present when the Abilities and Possibilities program was added around 2008 and allowed Nevins to offer the opportunity for participants to pay to come to Nevins (if they did not qualify otherwise). He also talks about the significant changes made to the buildings at Nevins, with complete restorations done to a lot of its physical structures.

He says that the participants are the reason he has stayed on the board for so long. "When you go to Nevins, they are the first ones to hug you and ask how you are doing (and always with a smile). These are adults who will make you feel good, no matter what you are going through in life." Jade is motivated to help spread awareness about Nevins and its participants. He asks that everyone who could help Nevins to please do so in any way possible. "We owe that to our fellow citizens of Charlotte, who need our help."


